Weird Nest embraces diversity by supporting diverse people to develop their creative skills.

Weird Nest has 4 streams of activity



Creative Agency Program (CAP)

Disability inclusive workshops for young people. Participants develop teamwork, creativity, self-confidence and specific creative interests. Workshops are held in Waverley LGA venues with support from Waverley Council.

Youth Ensemble

An ensemble of young people who have come through our Creative Agency Program. Together, they further develop performance skills and focus on a major project. True To Nature is their current production. Choreography, music, costuming, stage/set elements and script are co-designed with the ensemble.





Weirding Ways

An inclusive performance program for professional artists with an improvisation practice. The program involves research, creativity and public presentation in a playful no-expectations, no-pressure environment. This project embraces diversity by engaging a different artist team for each month. Artists so far have included a broad spectrum of backgrounds, interests and skills.

Artform and Artist Development Support

We continuously investigate ways of nurturing leadership by neurodiverse artists living with and without disability. Our community and public programs all involve leadership with lived experience as facilitators, project leads, board members and company directors.

In 2023 we;

- contributed to a sector planning discussion hosted by Creative Australia
- researched and implemented an inclusive governance model with support from BrandX
- provided access strategy feedback to two arts companies
- provided access and producing support to 3 associated artists for their projects.
