Artistic Leadership Structure

Weird Nest Artistic Committee

- Weird Nest is focused on supporting artists with disabling neurodivergence.
- This committee supports the program director with planning
 - o an annual program of weekly workshops,
 - small performances,
 - o accessibility and practice research.

Weirding Ways Artistic Committee

- Weirding Ways supports diverse artists to exchange practices and fosters community support with monthly public presentations and workshops
- This committee reviews processes, partnerships, direction and stakeholder communications.

Closely Associated Individual Artists and Groups

- Closely associated artists approach chronology arts with project proposals. We work with artists who;
 - o inspire others with the depth of their practice or expression,
 - o embrace diversity inclusion and
 - have demonstrated commitment to their practice.

Artistic Facilitator

Consults with chronology arts' associated artists and artistic committees, administration contractors and staff, as well as presenters, funders, venues and audience. With this information, resources are known, artistic objectives by associated individuals and groups are known, and it becomes possible to match similarly motivated artists with projects and resources.

Administration Structure

Board

Ensures compliance, solvency and supports the artistic facilitator to make decisions, manage risk and lead sustainable development.

Artistic Facilitator

Collaborates with artists to develop realistic artistic planning and communications appropriate to all relevant communications contexts related to their projects. With support from administration and finance staff, the artistic facilitator leads communications with stakeholders via funding applications, presentation applications, social media and direct messaging.

Administration (Communications, finance, sustainability development)

Executes communications, data entry and research projects that relate to artist sustainability.

Supports reporting to stakeholders.

Administration capacity is flexible and can increase or decrease with capacity and need. Core administration is minimal and voluntary.
